

As I make my closing statement, I would like to especially thank my Executive Secretary for her help and loyalty. Her help has made my challenges of leadership much easier.



CONSTITUTION of THE LEBANON VIRGINIA BAPTIST ASSOCIATION and ALLIED BODIES

PREAMBLE

We, the officers and members of the Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association, The South James River Sunday School and Baptist Training Union Convention and The Women's Missionary and Educational Circle, in order to form a more unified thrust in our Christian life decided to merge and become one organization in 1991. The Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association had existed for one hundred and eight years, The South James River Sunday School and Baptist Training Union Convention had existed one hundred and three years and the Women's Missionary and Educational Circle has existed for seventy years.

Realizing that the Christian Front should be united in love and brotherhood to promote the general welfare, and secure the blessing of God to ourselves, and our posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association and Allied Bodies.

ARTICLE I Name

This body shall be known as The Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association and Allied Bodies.

Article II Membership

Section I

This association shall be composed of Baptist Churches which are approved by the Association. Sunday School Unions, Ministries. Laymen and Life Members who are Baptists and remain Baptist and pay the required sums of monies as required by the Association.

- (a) Churches, Sunday School Unions. Ministers and Las men who are Baptist may become members by request and acceptance of the Association and by paying the required fees and paying the minimum sum of money for appropriations. Fees and appropriations may be changed from time to time by the Association while in session.
- (b) Ministers and Laymen may become members by paying a joining fee and an annual fee. These fees shall be determined by the Association.
- (c) Every church in the Association shall be entitled to representation in the Association; five (5) delegates and the Pastor shall be admitted from each Church for voting purposes.

Section II

The Association shall have five (5) Divisions: The Division of Clergy, The Division of Christian Education, The Division of Missions, The Division of Laymen and the Division of Youth.

Section III

All churches and/or organizations who wish to leave the Association to join another body are requested to notify the Association in writing.

Section IV

The Association and its Allied Bodies shall reserve the right to withdraw the Hand of Fellowship from Churches and Organizations who shall cherish principles contrary to the Gospel of Christ.

Article III Objectives

Section I

The Objectives of the Association and its Allied Bodies shall be:

- (a) To spread the Redeemer's Kingdom (Jesus Christ) upon the earth by doing all in their power to support the Chartered Foster Homes and Foreign Missions, viz., Lott Cary Foreign Mission
- (b) To support certain educational institutions and colleges viz., Virginia Union Virginia Seminary and College, and the United Negro College Fund
- (c) To support the Children's Home of Virginia Baptist, Inc.
- (d) To provide scholarships through the Bolden Bradby Memorial Scholarship Fund for worthy students from member churches. The Scholarship Committee and approved criteria shall determine the scholarship recipients
- (e) To provide training which shall enhance the spread of the Gospel of Jesus Christ
- (f) To provide a Relief Fund for Ministers and Deacons

Article IV Officers

Section I

The Officers of the Association shall be Moderator, First Vice-Moderator, Second-Vice Moderator, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Executive Secretary and five Division Presidents.

- (a) The Moderator shall serve one term (two years) and may succeed himself one term (total of four years)
- (b) Officers shall be elected biannually and shall remain in office until others are elected in their place
- (c) The duties of the Officers shall be such as are common to such offices
- (d) The treasurer shall be bonded for such amounts as the Association maw deem necessary.
- (e) The Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association and Allied Bodies "Committee Training

- Manual —Revised" shall guide the Committee in their duties. The duties of the Committees may be changed from time to time to meet the needs of the Association
- (f) The Committees shall be: Budget and Finance. Civic. Condolence, Hospitality. New Bodies, Public Relations and Editing, Registration, Temperance and Scholarship.
- (g) The Moderator may appoint committees as needed to further the work of the Association.

Section II

There shall be an Executive Council. The Executive Council shall be composed of the Moderator. First Vice-Moderator. Second Vice-Moderator. Executive Secretary and the Presidents of the Five Divisions. a total of nine (9) members.

Article V Meetings

Section I

The Association shall meet the following dates:

- (a) The Annual Session shall be held on the week following the second Lord's Day in July, beginning on Tuesday and ending on Friday.
- (b) The Fall Session shall be held on the Saturday following the second Lord's Day in October.
- (c) The Winter Session shall be held oil the Saturday following the first Lord's Day in January.
- (d) The Spring Session shall be held on the Saturday following the first Lord's Day in April.

Article VI

The honor of "Dean" shall be bestowed upon a member. The title of Dean shall be appointed by the Moderator when it becomes vacant.

Article VII Amendments

The Constitution may be amended at any meeting of this body provided that proper notice is given to each member church. There will be one official reading at one session and may he voted on at the next session.



FALL PLANNING SESSION

Saturday, September 12, 2010 Poplar Lawn Baptist Church – Surry, VA

The planning session met at the Poplar Lawn Baptist Church following registration and breakfast. Present were Moderator Childs, First Vice-Moderator Lucas, Second Vice-Moderator Dr. Adams and representatives from churches in the Association (18 members total).

DEVOTIONS

The meeting opened at 9:40 a.m. with the scripture reading of Ephesians 6:10-18 and prayer by Moderator Childs.

PAST BUSINESS

REVIEW OF THE ANNUAL SESSION

Deacon Joseph Anderson thanked the committee for asking him to do the "Purpose." Dr. Thanks in turn thanked him for a job well done. Sis. JoAnne Jones stated that we need to look at the time allotted for the Special Interest Group because this always runs over and adjustments have to be made afterwards.

Getting information and and vouchers to the appropriate persons in a timely manner seems to be a problem. No one should have to run down this information. Moderator Childs stated that he made an adjustment in the stipends paid to facilitators, teachers, etc. who helped out at the Annual Session. He increased the amount by \$15.00 each. He believes in compensating people for their time and efforts. Sis. Gloria Wilson mentioned that the voucher may need to be revised.

It was noted that job descriptions for individual officers should be included in the Annual journal, as is with the different Committees. Dea. Edward Jones stated that there is a document of his information. Dr. Childs stated that this was not found in the old journals that Poplar Lawn has on file.

Division Chairs should get a copy of the Annual journal as do the delegates. Information from the various sessions should be included in the Annual journal. Information from meetings should be submitted to the Executive Secretary by the following meeting. This would facilitate the information being compiled for the Annual Session as we go along.

Treasurer, Sis. Angelia Cosby stated that she needs to be informed when speakers are present, so the checks can be written at that time and not in advance (in case the person scheduled does not show up). This is to avoid the wasting of checks. 2nd Vice Moderator, Dr. Douglas Adams stated that this responsibility should remain with that particular chairperson who is responsible for retaining the speaker.

All new information that comes up this morning will be critiqued, compiled and mailed. Bro. Albert Elliott stated that he needs a listing of condolences in a timely manner. It was stated by Dea. Edward Jones that this has been revised and should be turned in at each session.

PRESENT BUSINESS

COMMITTEE (S) REPORTS

TREASURER'S REPORT

Treasurer, Sis. Angelia Cosby gave a verbal summary of the Treasurer's report. Moderator Childs stated that the Operating Budget is the Assessment from the Churches. All other expenses will be deducted to show the true Operating Expenses. Also, some operating cost is being absorbed by churches. Dr. Childs stated that Poplar Lawn carried its assessment up by \$200.00. Poplar Lawn is also absorbing mailing expenses and some of the Annual Journal expenses. With all of this taken into account, we will compile a "true" Operating Budget.

BUDGET

The Christian Education budget should take care of both the quarterly session and the Annual Session. July to June is the fiscal year for the Association. Each church is assessed \$600.00 per year. Some churches pay more; some pay less; some have unofficially dropped out of the Association.

FUTURE BUSINESS

Letters will be sent to the inactive member churches. They will be given a deadline to respond before they are dropped. A follow-up letter may also be sent. Dea. Edward Jones found several copies of the Constitution which noted \$20.00 as the joining fee for churches, but this had not been updated in the Annual Journals. Sis. Eunice Gay suggested that a committee of ministers go out and encourage these inactive churches to come back. 1st Vice Moderator, Dr. Lucas stated that in preparing his thesis, he found research showing that some churches do not want to be under any kind of ruling body. Moderator, Dr. Childs stated that some of these churches have been inactive for years and that the Association has continued sending them correspondence for meetings and sessions. 2nd Vice Moderator, Dr. Adams stated that the Association needs to do a better job at marketing our organization. This can be done by education

and brainstorming. Sis. Gay stated that a lot of people whose children participate, do not know the purpose or what the Association is all about.

Sis. Cosby suggested that maybe we need to collect ads for our Annual Journal. This would help bring in revenue to help pay for our journal as well as advertise our Association. Sis. JoAnne Jones suggested that maybe the Annual Journal can be saved to CD (Compact Disc) to reduce the cost of making books. The budget for the Annual Journals will be assessed at \$1,000.

Sis. Angelia Cosby asked that the Christian Education Division and the Youth Division, who have been separated, submit separate budgets and submit separate itemized expenses for each

The Ambassadors for Christ Special Interest Group was added to the budget. Dea. Edward Jones shared that Dr. Daniel Baltimore stated that the C.A.B. Ministry budget should be split between these two groups.

The Scholarship Committee representative stated that they allotted each applicant \$300, however, the amount should have been \$500.00

Sis. Eunice Gay gave a report on what the Youth Workshop would entail and who the speakers will be. She wanted to know how much time she would be granted for the workshop. Dr. Childs will get back with her on this.

Dr. Childs stated that the Moderator is the official representative for the LVBA at the Baptist General Convention, however, we can send a delegate, even though we do not have the money.

The profit to the treasury is about \$1,100 for the Annual Session Banquet.

Dr. Lucas presented the love offering to the Hospitality committee (3 persons) and thanked them for the delicious breakfast.

BENEDICTION

The Fall Planning Session adjourned at 12:00 with prayer by Dr. Lucas.

DEVOTIONS

The planning session opened following breakfast. Moderator Dr. Bruce Childs and 2nd Vice-Moderator Dr. Douglas Adams were present, along with thirteen (13) other members present. Moderator Childs called the session to order at 9:35 a.m. He opened with scripture taken from Ephesians 4. which deals with working together in unity and followed with Prayer.

PAST BUSINESS

REVIEW OF FALL SESSION (DIVISION OF YOUTH)

Moderator Childs stated that all of the seminars sessions were very good, especially the one getting the children involved in Childhood Obesity. It was also noted that one of the main proponents—the adults who do the shopping were not in big attendance at the seminar. The seminars were good for the adults, as well as for the youth. Dr. Childs thanked Sis Eunice Gay, the Youth Division President, for a great session.

Dr. Childs stated that Sis. Seneca Bock, the facilitator who spoke on Childhood Obesity, also wants to get something started in our area that will help us as far as our health. She will be talking to other pastors in the area.

PRESENT BUSINESS

COMMITTEE (S) REPORTS:

No reports were given.

Concerning the Bolden Bradby Scholarship Fund, Moderator Dr. Bruce Childs, stated that nothing has been done lately to generate funds. Sis. Clara Jones stated that she and Dea. Edward Jones had a discussion and it was noted that awards have already been given to all noted persons and maybe the Association can direct these funds to the Bolden Bradby Scholarship Fund. Sis. Gloria Wilson stated that she will take the responsibility for First Gravel Hill not taking care of their assessment. Due to their pastoral transition, this was forgotten. In the past a banquet was held to raise funds for the scholarships; however somehow the focus got changed from the youths to the

Awards Banquet. Sis. Roslyn Elliott stated that she feels that after expenses from the Annual Banquet, the proceeds should go to the Bolden Bradby Scholarship Fund. Dr. Daniel Baltimore stated that in agreement with Sis. Lucy Butler, it would be good to combine the Banquet Awards for the Adults and the Bolden Bradby Scholarship Banquet. It was noted by Moderator Childs, that the scholarship award was changed to \$500.00 for graduates. This amount was also listed in the LVBA Annual Session journal. The amount allotted was \$400.00. Dr. Baltimore asked that consideration be given to amending the amount to state \$500.00 if the funds are available at such time. Sis. Elliott asked why the Bolden Bradby Scholarship Fund could not operate as a separate entity. This would help keep controls within the Association.

Dr. Childs stated that Sandy Mount plans to come back into the LVBA as an active member. We are counting 17 churches as part of the Association. This could net \$10,200 in appropriation from member churches. Dr. Childs stated that he had considered asking the churches to raise their assessment, but he noticed that some churches are already paying more than the mandated \$600.00 per year assessment.

It was suggested by the Moderator to only do 34 books instead of 100 (2 for each member church). The churches hopefully will be able to absorb the cost of the paper and ink. This is what Poplar Lawn is doing.

Certain budget cuts were made for the year. Badges for delegates will be done by the Executive Secretary due to the cut of the Registration Package budget line.

FUTURE BUSINESS

WINTER SESSION

Christian Education Division President, Sis. JoAnne Jones was not able to attend this meeting, so Dr. Childs read her proposal for the upcoming Winter Session. The Winter Session will be held at Lebanon Baptist Church.

Dr. Daniel Baltimore thanked the Kitchen Committee of Poplar Lawn for the Breakfast and presented them with a donation that was collected from attendees.

There being no further business, the planning session was adjourned. Benediction was given by 2nd Vice Moderator, Dr. Douglas Adams.

DEVOTIONS

The planning session opened following breakfast. Moderator Dr. Bruce Childs and 2nd Vice-Moderator Dr. Douglas Adams were present, along with thirteen (13) other members. Moderator Childs called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m, opening with scripture taken from Ephesians 4:1-10.

PAST BUSINESS

REVIEW OF WINTER SESSION

Moderator Childs voiced his thanks for Lebanon Baptist Church and Pastor Gregory Spurlock for hosting the Winter Session. Christian Ed Division President, Sis. JoAnne Jones gave an overview of the Winter Session. It was noted that Dr. James Harrison who facilitated the biblical seminar promised to send us his handouts, since he did not have them available at the time of the session. Several members inquired about the handouts. Moderator Childs stated that he would call Dr. Harrison about getting them. The general consensus is that the Winter Session was very good.

PRESENT BUSINESS

COMMITTEE REPORTS

REPORT OF PROPOSED BUDGET 2010-2011

Moderator Childs reviewed the 2009-2010 Proposed budget cuts. One highlighted change is that we will only print manuals for the delegates we have names for (probably about 30 or more). The registration package budget was cut to zero. It was also noted that the BGC/VUL that are listed together were sent \$1,000. This amount has been cut in half. We are not sure if the \$1,000 was being split between the two, so we decided to send each check separately. A check will be sent to the Childrens' Home in the amount of \$1,000. The Deacons/Ministers Relief budget was cut to zero because they have intake coming in.

BOLDEN BRADBY SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Bolden Bradby Scholarship Committee was not represented at this meeting. Dr. Childs stated that this is the 2nd year that we have not had extra funds coming in to support the scholarships. During Rev. Robert Elliott's tenure as President of the Scholarship Fund, the churches were asked to make donations to the fund. Dea. Edward Jones stated that some of the churches are still supporting. The amount over and above the \$600.00 appropriation can be slotted to go to the scholarship fund or wherever the donating church designates. Dr. Childs stated that if this is done, the budget would need to be cut even more. Dr. Daniel Baltimore stated that a fundraiser would probably be the best solution. Dea. Edward Jones stated that the Bolden Bradby Scholarship Committee never intended to have fund-raisers to support the scholarship. He suggested that the Awards Banquet should be used to support the scholarship fund. Dr. Childs stated that we will have to come up with a plan to put more emphasis on it and someone from the Bolden Bradby Scholarship Committee needs to be present at meetings

FUTURE BUSINESS

The Spring Session will be held at Morning Star Baptist Church on Saturday, April 10, 2010. The Division of Laymen and Clergy are in charge.

Dr. Daniel Baltimore and Dea. Joseph Anderson gave an overview of what is planned for the Laymen and Clergy Division Spring Session. Dr. Baltimore stated that his information for the session would be submitted in about ten (10) days.

A revision to the LVBA Mission Agenda was distributed.

Sis. JoAnne Jones is requesting to have Rev. Robert Palmer as her Vice-President for the Christian Education Division. Dr. Childs wanted clarity on the formal process before allowing this to become official. Sis. Jones will get back to the Executive Secretary concerning his.

Sis. JoAnne Jones stated that the Christian Education Division will be having a Bible Bowl during the Annual Session. She will be calling on some individuals for support.

It was noted that we will need to get someone to fill the deceased Dea. Frank Butler's office as Finance President. We should try to do this by the next session in April. The Finance President's signature is needed on checks.

Per the Constitution, those member churches who have not paid their assessment for a period of time can be automatically dropped.

Moderator Childs informed the planning session members that a new church has been established by Rev. Dennis K. Ellis. This church is named Tabernacle Baptist Church.

EDIFICATION AND MINISTRY SHARING

Dr. Adams thanked the Kitchen Committee for the delicious breakfast they prepared.


MEET THE VICE-PRESIDENT OF THE DIVISION OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION REVEREND ROBERT PALMER

all James loves worshipping God and giving praise to Jesus Christ.


STEPHANIE BECKETT







ORDINATION AND RECOGNITION OF ORDINATION IN LEBANON VIRGINIA BAPTIST ASSOCIATION CHURCHES

Introduction: We recognize and celebrate the autonomy and diversity of our member congregations which make up our Association and Allied Bodies. We bring together differing styles and patterns of worship through which God has worked. In bringing these together we affirm our autonomy and diversity, even as we seek to work together in mutual ministry for Christ. While Ordination grows out of our need to extend ministry and service beyond the local church, this mutual ministry calls for a process of affirmation and recognition of ordination by the congregations which make up the churches of the Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association and Allied Bodies.

THE ORDINATION PROCESS: A congregation desiring an ordination to be recognized in L VBA is encouraged to follow these guidelines and procedures. L VBA a ffirms the autonomy of all the local congregations which make up the Association and Allied Bodies.

- The congregation desiring ordination for a candidate, should contact the Moderator via written communication to start the process of ordination.
- The Moderator should contact the President of the Division of Clergy, who shall contact the local congregation and the candidate to clarify and facilitate the process.
- The Division of Clergy along with the candidate's pastor shall call for an Ordination Council and recommend to the local congregation that an Ordination Council be called informing the congregation of those steps to be taken before calling an Ordination Council. The Council shall review the candidate's background in the following areas:
 - a Christian Character and the Lordship of Christ as evidenced in Christian Ministry
 - b Understanding of the Purpose of the Church and its Ministry
 - c Call to the Christian Ministry
 - d Readiness to meet with an Ordination Council, reviewing the Statement of Faith
- The Candidate shall prepare a "Statement of Faith" for the Ordination Council. It shall include a comprehensive understanding of Christian doctrine and practice, including an understanding of God, Christ and the Holy Ghost; the purpose and place of the Church in today's world; an understanding of the ordinances as practiced by the congregations of L VBA, personal commitment to the ministry and the relationship of the local congregatio1J to the Association and Allied Bodies; and the role of the minister I pastor.
- The local congregation in cooperation with the Division of Clergy shall invite every Church in the Association to send both clergy and laity to form the Ordination Council. Where appropriate, the catechizer should be agreed upon by the Candidate's Pastor and the local conllregation_ The Sllitement of Faith shall be uresented to the Ordination Council.

RECOGNITION OF ORDINATION OTHER THAN LVBA

- 1. A congregation desiring the recognition of the ordination of an individual coming from a tradition other than the L VBA shall first contact the Moderator via written communication.
- 2. The congregation will proceed to call an Ordination Council. Included among those invited will be all LVBA member congregations.
- 3. On the day of the Ordination Council there must be at least four ordained LVBA clergy. Those attending the Council will question the candidate on the issues of faith and ministry with a special emphasis on issues relating to ministry with the L VBA (address in f the issues of ethnic inclusion, ecumenical witness, women in ministry and the relationship of the local congregation to the Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association.)
- 4. A clerk's report of the attendance and action of the Ordination Council will be sent to the local congregation and moderator. The LVBA will formally recognize the ordination.
- 5. The LVBA will formally recognize the ordination.



Steps for congregations of L VBA to take In preparation for ordination

- A congregation desiring an ordination for a candidate (to be recognized by LVBA) will contact the Moderator by written communication.
- The candidate should prepare a written Statement of Faith which shall include an understanding of Christian Doctrine and Practice, including an understanding of God, Christ and the Holy Spirit; the purpose and place of the Church in today's world; and understanding of the Ordinances as practiced in Baptist Churches; personal commitment to the ministry of Christ in Lebanon Virginia Churches (addressing the issues of ethnic inclusion, ecumenical witness, women in ministry and the relationship of the local congregation to the Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association Churches) and the role of the minister.
- The congregation and its pastor or board of deacons will proceed to call an Ordination Council. Included among those invited will be all of the LVBA congregations.
- On the day of the Ordination Council there must be in attendance at least four ordained clergy persons active in LVBA. Those attending the council will question the candidate on the issues addressed in the Statement of Faith and on other appropriate concerns of faith and ministry.
- A clerk's report of the attendance and action of the Ordination Council will be made known to the local congregation and moderator. If the decision of the council was positive the moderator and member churches should be notified of the date of the scheduled Service of Ordination.
- The LVBA at this point will formally recognize the Ordination on behalf of all member congregations.

- The President of the Division of Clergy may serve as the Clerk of the Council.
- 7
 The Service of Ordination shall be held by the local congregation; always seeking to include member congregations.
- A report of the Ordination Council shall be presented at this Service of Ordination.
- The Division of Clergy shall formally recognize the Ordination on behalf of the Association and Allied Bodies.

Recognition of Ordinations shall be met with the same standards as those required by first time Ordinands.




BOLDEN BRADBY SCHOLARSHIP FUND

- 1) All applicants must be a member in good standing of a church that is a member in good standing of the Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association.
- All applicants should have good moral and ethical character as attested to by their Pastors.
- 3) All applicants must meet the approval of their individual churches as authorized by their Pastors.
- All applications must be typed and signed by the applicant.
- 5) Verification will be made on applicant's statement that he/she is enrolled or attending a college, university, or vocational school prior to awarding of any scholarship.
- 6) The Bolden Bradby Memorial Scholarship will be awarded to an applicant one time only.
- 7) The scholarship will be awarded to students who have completed at least one semester or one quarter of an approved institution of higher learning. The scholarship will be awarded in the month of January.
- 8) All applications must be received by May 1st. No applicants will be received after this deadline.
- 9) The awards committee reserves the discretionary powers to determine the amount and the number of awards to be given.
- 10) The scholarship committee will maintain a list of alumni who have been recipients of the fund.

FOREWORD

The work of the Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association is contingent upon the smooth and methodical workings of the committee, which has been established. This manual has been prepared to provide each committee with its purpose, method of operation and its responsibilities to the Association.

We have attempted to provide the basic framework for each committee, bearing in mind that all items have been completely detailed and that each committee may find the need to make minor adjustments as they meet and work.

Each committee is responsible for making an annual report to the Association and some committees may be required to make additional reports during the year to the Executive Council. Deadlines for each report will be established so that the report may be printed in advance of a scheduled meeting or function and then made available at that meeting for our members and delegates. We thank you for your prayerful and cheerful cooperation as we work together.

CIVIC COMMITTEE

The Civic Committee has the responsibility of researching the concerns of the citizens in communities of member churches. In turn, the Civic Committee is to make recommendations to the Association what action should be taken.

- 1) The committee will function throughout the year and will hold meetings according to its own calendar.
- 2) Areas of special concern include:
 - a) Voter registration
 - b) Racial, gender and age discrimination
 - c) Educational issues, etc.
- 3) The committee will make a report at the Annual Session as to its specific activities.

CONDOLENCE COMMITTEE

The Condolence Committee is to make record of and report to the Association the names, addresses and the name of churches of members who die within the reporting period (each of the four meetings of the Association).

- 1) The committee will function throughout the year.
- The committee will establish and maintain contact with specific individuals of member churches in the Association.

HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE

The Hospitality Committee will work with an ad hoc committee established by the church which hosts a meeting or function of the Association. The responsibilities include:

- 1) Making provisions for meals, parking, and directing of guests throughout the church building.
- 2) Any additional needs or services to be performed by this committee will be requested through the Pastor of the host church.
- 3) The Association through this committee will extend its formal thanks to the host church at the end of the meeting or function.

NEW BODIES COMMITTEE

The New Bodies Committee will serve as the instrument through which perspective churches will become familiar with the Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association and Allied Bodies. When perspective churches are presented, the New Bodies Committee will hold

dialogue with the candidate congregation to inform them of the atmosphere of fellowship found in the Lebanon Association rules and regulations, expectations, etc. The New Bodies Committee, after the dialogue, will make recommendations pertaining to the perspective congregation at the Annual Session.

The New Bodies Committee will actively solicit the involvement of Baptist Churches which have no affiliation with any Association.

The New Bodies Committee will maintain accurate records of meetings and this report will also be made at the Annual Session.

EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

The members of the Executive Council will share equality in the responsibilities of guiding the Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association and Allied Bodies. The Executive Council will exercise the rights and authority to form policy, give direction and set action under the auspices of the Association. The duties of the Executive Council will be:

- 1) To give leadership and direction to the Association
- 2) Preparing and recommending the annual budget.
- 3) Developing the annual calendar for the Association
- 4) Outlining the programs for the Association
- 5) Selecting speakers, preachers and presenters for the Association
- 6) Confer meetings to consider the concerns of the Association
- 7) Fulfill all other duties as specified by the Association

BUDGET & FINANCE COMMITTEE

The Budget and Finance Committee shall prepare and monitor the budget for the Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association and Allied Bodies and will have the responsibility of attending to the fiscal concerns of the Association.

- 1) This committee shall consist of no more than seven (7) members and no less than three (3) members; one of whom will be the treasurer. Members serving will be appointed by the Executive Council. Terms of service will be staggered (4 years). The treasurer and the Chairman will not be limited to term.
- 2) The names of three (3) members of the committee will be registered at the banking institution(s). Any two (2) names of the three registered names will make a check valid.
- 3) The committee will receive recommendations and reports from sources (i.e., Moderators, Presidents, Scholarship Committee, Public Relations, individuals and etc.) in preparation of the budget.

- 4) The budget shall be based upon the annual contributions of the member churches at the annual meeting.
- 5) The budget becomes effective January 1, subject to approval by the Association following the annual session.
- 6) Member churches will be encouraged to make semi-annual, tri-annual or quarterly contributions
- The fiscal year for the Association shall be from January 1 through December
 31.
- 8) All requests for funds shall be by voucher, be the request budgeted or not. All vouchers must bear the signature of the Moderator.
- 9) The Committee shall be sure of the balance of the Association. A bi-annual typewritten report will be submitted to the Executive Council and will include the following information:
 - a) Numerical listing of each check
 - b) Date of each check
 - c) To whom the check was written (purpose and amount)

A quarterly report should be made at each session listing the receipts and expenses.

A complete annual finance report should be made at the annual session.

10) The committee shall submit its books for annual audit by January 31 of each year. The results of the audit will be reported at the annual session.

PUBLIC RELATIONS

The Public Relations Committee has the responsibility of relaying the occasions, events, items of interest and business of the Association to its officers, member churches and delegates and to the media (newspaper, radio, t.v.) where applicable. The committee is also responsible for the compiling, printing and distribution of the minutes of each session of the Association; training or seminar materials and the Annual Journal. The Executive Secretary of the Association shall chair this committee. Specific duties arid responsibilities include:

- 1) The committee shall review all reports and items which will be entered into the Annual Journal and to conduct all editing procedures necessary for printing.
- 2) The journal shall be prepared and submitted to the Executive Council by April 1 each year. (council should submit Journal for publication by May 1)
- 3) The Journal shall be ready for distribution to member churches by June 15. Each church will receive 6 copies of the Journal. The Council will indicate time and place for distribution.
- 4) An annual report shall be made to the Association.

REGISTRATION COMMITTEE

The Registration Committee has the responsibility of accurately registering all delegates, representatives and guest on all occasions, functions and events of the Association where registration is applicable. Pre-registration will be encouraged for the sessions. The registration information will include:


- 1) The occasion and date
- 2) Name of delegate, representative or guest (their name, address [zip code] telephone number [area code])
- 3) Church represented/name of Pastor or organization
 - a) The committee will prepare appropriate badge and other forms of identification for registrants and the packets for the annual session.
 - b) The committee will work together with the Public Relations and Hospitality Committees to provide technical or logistical support to member churches who will host functions or events of the Association.
 - c) The committee will make a report on the number of registrations after each session. An annual report shall be made in the July session.

TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE

The Temperance Committee will identify for the Association, the areas where there is need for strong Christian influence and self-control. As much as possible, the committee will address specific concerns within the communities of our member churches and make recommendations to the Association accordingly.

OTHER COMMITTEES

The Moderator may appoint other committees as needed for the growth of the Association. Current appointments include the Music Committee (responsible for providing the music for each session) and the History Committee (responsible for compiling the history of the Association and Allied Bodies from their beginnings through the merger and following).
