CONSTITUTION

Constitution of The Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association and Allied Bodies

Adopted June 23, 2012 (Revisions are in red)

We, the officers and members of the Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association, The South James River Sunday School and Baptist Training Union Convention and The Women's Missionary and Educational Circle, in order to form a more unified thrust in our Christian life decided to merge and become one organization in 1991. The Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association had existed for one hundred and eight years, The South James River Sunday School and Baptist Training Union Convention had existed one hundred and three years and the Women's Missionary and Educational Circle has existed for seventy years.

Realizing that the Christian Front should be united in love and brotherhood to promote the general welfare, and secure the blessing of God to ourselves, and our posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association and Allied Bodies.

ARTICLE I

This body shall be known as The Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association and Allied Bodies.

Article II Membership

Section I:

This association shall be composed of Baptist Churches which are approved by the Association, Sunday School Unions, Ministries, Laymen and Life Members who are Baptists and remain Baptist and pay the required sums of monies as required by the Association.

- a) Churches, Sunday School Unions, Ministers and Laymen who are Baptist may become members by request and acceptance of the Association and by paying the required fees and paying the minimum sum of money for appropriations. Fees and appropriations may be changed from time to time by the Association while in session.
- b) Ministers and Laymon may become members by paying a joining fee and an annual fee. These fees shall be determined by the Association.
 The language in this statement is deleted and replaced with the federaling revision (per administrate vote by the Delegates and Pasters at the April 13, 2013 Session).

Revision:

(b) In order to serve as an officer of the Association, an individual must be a momber in good standing of one of the Lebanca Virginia Equita Association and Allied Bodies churches.

c) Every church in the Association shall be entitled to representation in the Association; five (5) delegates and the Pastor shall be admitted from each Church

for voting purposes.

6) Each church shall cent a list of we chare than five (5) delegates (The list shall be signed by the paster or the church's designated representative, in the absence of the paster). Form is included in the Amuni Journal forms section. Churches she'll assign one person to pick up their church's journals.

Section II

The Association shall have five (5) Divisions whose general duties will be to bring term programs, reminars or workshops for both adults and yearlie. These programs, icc., will be presented or facilitated at the sessions of the association by the persons knowledgeable in the field or topic(s) being presented. Duties of each division shall also be as needed or requested by the Moderator.

The Division of Clergy - It was to be settled

The Division of Christian Education

Duties: To support the LVBA in carrying out its objectives, to provide training which shall enhance Christian growth, to promote support to churches of the LVBA in their Christian Education development, and to preform any duties specified by the Moderator.

The Division of Missions

Butier: To provide leadership to the Missions' body, to keep members chreast of all activities of the Association pertaining to missions, beneficial in making the Missions' Division more effective, to nitend meetings as necessary, to perform any other duties specified by the Madorator.

The Division of Laymen

Duties: To exait the Savier, equip the salats, evangelize the sinner. The izity is the mighty army in every church, capable of reaching people in their own clearch and arms for Christ. Lay people and panters work together. The church is built up and the mighty work of God is accomplished.

Division of Youth

Duties: To promote friendship and collaboration with other yours ministries within LVBA, to provide educational experiences that will enhance the growth and development

- (a) The Moderator shall serve one term (two years) and may succeed himself one term (total of four years) If for any reason the offices of Moderator, Ist Victo-Moderator, or I^{nt} Victo-Moderator or I^{nt} Victo-Moderator or I^{nt} Victo-Moderator or I^{nt} Victo-Moderator with move for ward to the upperment office. The Moderator or Executive Council will have the discretion of filling the vacant position for that particular term. This will not affect the term that is already in session.
- (b) Officers shall be elected biznmuzlly and shall remain in office until others are elected in their place.
- (c) The duties of the Officers shall be such as are common to such offices.
- (d) The treasurer shall be bonded for such amounts as the Association may deem necessary.
- (e) The Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association and Allied Bodies "Committee Training Manual –Revised" shall guide the Committee in their duties. The duties of the Committees may be changed from time to time to meet the needs of the Association.
- (f) The Committees shall be: Budget and Finance, Condolence, Hospitality, New Bodies, Registration, Boliver Brazily, Scholarship, Non-trading, History, Newsic, Time and Place, Winisters' and Decours' Relief.
- (g) The Moderator may appoint committees as needed to further the work of the Association.

Section II

There shall be an Executive Council. The Executive Council shall be composed of the Moderator, First Vice-Moderator, Second Vice-Moderator, Executive Secretary and the Presidents of the Five Divisions, a total of nine (9) members.

Article V Meetings

Section I

The Association shall meet the following dates:

- (a) The Annual Session shall be held on the week following the second Lord's Day in July, beginning on Tuesday and ending on Friday.
- (b) The Fall Session shall be held on the Saturday following the second Lord's Day in October.
- (c) The Winter Session shall be held on the Saturday following the first Lord's Day in January.

of our youth through program development, workshops, sendnars, activities, and field trips that will lead to Christian maturity.

Section III

All churches and/or organizations who wish to leave the Association to join another body are requested to notify the Association in writing.

Section IV

The association and its Allied Bodies shall reserve the right to withdraw the Hand of Fellowship from Churches and Organizations who shall cherish principles contrary to the Gospel of Christ.

Article III Objectives

Section I

The Objectives of the Association and its Allied Bodies shall be:

- (a) To spread the Redeemer's Kingdom (Jesus Christ) upon the earth by doing all in their power to support the Chartered Foster Homes and Foreign Missions, and., Lott Cary Foreign Mission,
- (b) To support certain educational institutions and colleges; Virginia Union University, Virginia University of Lynchburg, and the United Negro College Fund.
- (c) To support the Children's Home of Virginia Baptist, Inc.,
- (d) To provide scholarships through the Bolden Bradby Memorial Scholarship Fund for worthy students from member churches. Satisfaction of the approved criteria shall determine the scholarship: recipients.
- (e) To provide training which shall enhance the spread of the Gospel of Jesus Christ,
- (f) To provide a Relief Fund for Ministers and Deacons.

Article IV Officers

Section I

The Officers of the Association shall be Moderator, First Vice-Moderator, Second-Vice Moderator, Recording Secretary, Assistant Recording Secretary, Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Executive Secretary and five Division Presidents.

(d) The Spring Session shall be held on the Saturday following the first Lord's Day in

Article VI

Any eneity of the Lebanda Baptisi Association and Alifed Bodies that requires a membership fee or amount change for membership shan have approval of the Moderator and Executive Council in order to become effective. (Example: Deacons and Ministers Relief Fee increase!

Article VII Dean

The honor of "Dean" shall be bestowed upon a member. The title of Dean shall be appointed by the Moderator when it becomes vacant.

Article VIII Amendments

The Constitution may be amonded or selections added at a meeting of the Moderator's choosing prier to say session, provided that proper notice is given to each eligible member church. Notifications will be sent out at least two weeks prior to the meeting.

Dr. Lucas is a former member of the Board of Supervisors in Sussex County, serving for a period of six years, two of those years as

Vice- Chairman. He is also a former member of the Crater Disabilities Service Board of Southside Virginia.



Rev. Dr. Robert Elliott, Jr. - 1st Vice Moderator

Rev. Dr. Robert Lincoln. Elliott, Jr. is a native and currently resides in Claremont, located in Surry County, Virginia. Having four sisters, he is the only son born to Deaconess Dolly Elliott and the late Deacon Robert L. Elliott, Sr. After attending and graduating from Surry County Public Schools, he attended Norfolk State University before joining the United States Air Force. For four years while in the Air Force, he worked diligently with the Military Police Unit. That was where God taught him tolerance for all people in all circumstances.

Returning to civilian life, he joined the Prince George County Police Department where he remained for thirteen years, ending his service as a detective and the unofficial chaplain for the department. Pastor Elliott knew soon after God had a higher calling for him.

As a child of God and an anointed "leader of the flock", Pastor Elliott took the helm at Morning Star Baptist Church in 2001 - the church where he was baptized, where he was ordained as a deacon in 1988, where he was licensed as a minister in 1991, and where his family still actively attends. Being born into a musically gifted family, he truly believes that we should "make a joyful noise unto the Lord" and will often begin or end his sermons with a soulful musical offering.

Pastor Elliott's growth at Morning Star Baptist Church with the late Rev. Dr. E. L. Fleming as his pastor peaked when the Lord said, "Son, you are now ready" and God presented His choice for a messenger to the people in August 1991. Pastor Elliott grew under the functioning of the Holy Spirit and God sent him to the Union Baptist Church in Spring Grove, Virginia to lead His people. In February 1995, Pastor Elliott was ordained and served as the pastor of the Union Baptist Church for seven years.

Pastor Elliott continued his matriculation in the realms of Theology at the Richmond Virginia Seminary. In 1997, he received his Bachelor's degree from the Seminary. He has always believed in the power of prayer and possessed a strong desire to devote all of his time to doing the work of the Lord. He prayed and asked God to make a way. In March 2001, God answered his prayer and he was officially installed as the proud pastor of the Morning Star Baptist Church. In December 2008, the vision became a shepherd for his reality and the doors to the new sanctuary were opened to all.

Under his guidance as the spiritual shepherd for his Morning Star Family, Pastor Elliott has led his flock to greater heights and a better understanding of the infinite wisdom, mercies and goodness of God through His Word. His mission in life is to fulfill his vow to lead others to Christ and give God the best of his service.

Rev. Dr. Bobby Lee Taylor- 2nd Vice Moderator Sandy Mount Baptist Church, Smithfield, VA



The Reverend Dr. Bobby Lee Taylor was born in Evergreen, Alabama to Mr. and Mrs. Earnest Taylor and is the oldest of thirteen (13) children. At the age of eleven (11), he accepted Christ as his Lord and Savior and was baptized at the Mount Zion Baptist Church in Owassa, Alabama. He was educated in the public school system of Evergreen, Alabama. He received his calling to the Gospel ministry and was licensed to preach on August 14, 1983 and ordained on December 20, 1984. He has over twenty-five (25) years of progressively responsible experience in church work and administrative leadership. He has preached in several states and accumulated many awards and achievements in his Christian journey and has several years of voluntary chaplaincy service at the John Randolph Medical Center, Hopewell, Virginia.

Dr. Taylor is the former pastor of the Rising Mount Zion Baptist Church in Carson, Virginia, where he was pastor for eight (8) years and provided Spiritual knowledge and leadership in order for the members to achieve many goals in the Lord.

Reverend Dr. Taylor's educational track is one of great magnitude and hard work. Dr. Taylor's main goal as a minister and pastor is to be faithful to God, and to promote ministries and missions that will enhance God's people toward discipleship, evangelistic attributes, active membership, and a loving and supportive community of believers.

The Reverend Dr. Taylor was called to pastor the Sandy Mount Baptist Church of Smithfield, Virginia on November 21, 2011. On May 18, 2013, Dr. Taylor was elected 2nd Vice-Moderator of the Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association and Allied Bodies. Dr. Taylor is married to the former Gail Yolanda Jones and they are residents of Chester, Virginia. He loves to preach and teach and he will preach. One of his favorite scriptures is found in II Timothy 2:15, "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needs not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the words of truth."

Moderator Lucas stated that if the Association is to continue to be a success, we need to make some changes. Important business is not being handled due to the some officers not being present and reports not being available to discuss or complete the business of the Association. He stated that he

will meet again with the First and Second Moderators and a new letter will be drafted in order to move on with eliminating this absentee problem. Moderator Lucas stated that he did get a couple of responses from the previous letter that he sent to officers and delegates. Sis. Jacqueline Clarke is resigning her position as Chair of the New Bodies Committee and Sis. A. Jane Ellis is resigning her position as Chair of the Hospitality Committee. Moderator Lucas stated that Sis. Ellis suggested that this position might be handled by the Church hosting the Annual Session. It was noted that along with these two positions, there are several other vacant or non-reporting positions, including the Nominating Committee, whose sole responsibility is filling new or vacant positions. Dr. Lucas stated that persons nominated or accepting positions should show that he or she is interested or committed by showing up for sessions. He stated that he will not be putting people in positions just to fill vacancies. He further stated that if we don't have a working Nominating Committee, nominations will be handled from the floor.

FUTURE BUSINESS

The actual reading of the minutes of the Spring Planning Session was omitted.

PAST BUSINESS

Review of Spring Session (DIVISION OF LAYMEN)

Dr. Lucas asked for comments on the Spring Session, which was held at the Morning Star Baptist Church on Palm Sunday, April 9th at 3:00pm. Dr. Lucas stated that although the registration sheet showed a total of 192 sign-ins, there were some who arrived early or late and did not sign in. He stated that this was one of the largest turnouts that he had seen for the Association. The majority of the comments voiced were favorable. It was noted as "a good forward move, a great turnout—one that should continue." Dr. Lucas stated that if we do move forward with this new platform, changes will have to be made to the Association's Constitution. This forward move would affect all of the Division Sessions. It was suggested that we test the new platform for 12 months before making any modifications to the Constitution. Many churches have built-in calendared events, e.g. Church Anniversary, Pastor's Anniversary, etc. Dr. Elliott suggested that we would need to meet with the Association Pastors and review all of their church calendars, and try to synchronize new session dates that will not conflict with neither the Association sessions nor the Association church's events.

Moderator Lucas read from a copy given to him by Treasurer, Sis. Angelia Cosby.

2. Bolden Bradby Scholarship Report

Executive Secretary, Minister Sylvia Flood gave the financial report for the Bolden Bradby Scholarship Fund. She also read the names of the 13 applicants for the upcoming Bolden Bradby Scholarships. She stated that because of the passing of the Bolden Bradby Committee President, Reverend P.D. Wells, and the uncertainty of where to submit the applications, that some of the applicants went above and beyond to ensure that their application reached the Association by the May 1st deadline. Some were emailed and one was even taped to Minister Flood's door at home.

There was also some confusion about 4 of the applicants not receiving their scholarship award after the completion of their 1st semester of college. This was not true of at least

one of the names mentioned, whose check was in fact hand delivered to her just prior to her returning to college. It appears that there may be only 2 applicants who didn't get their scholarship check. Moderator Lucas stated that this can easily be taken care of. The money is not an issue. The confusion was probably due to the death of Reverend Wells and also the applicants thinking that they would be notified. The Bolden Bradby Scholarship procedures clearly states that the applicant <u>must</u> request his or her scholarship award, along with proof that he or she has satisfactorily completed the requirements of the first semester.

3. Deacons & Ministers Relief Report

President Morris Hall was absent due to a funeral he had to attend. Dr. Lucas encouraged Pastors and Deacons to take the message back to their church's deacons that they need to consider joining the Deacons and Ministers Relief, otherwise their widows would not eligible for a relief check.

Dr. Robert A. Diggs, Sr. is a native of Mathews, Virginia. He is the son of Frances V. Diggs and the late Robert E. Diggs of Cardinal, VA. He attended public school there and worshipped in the Zion Baptist Church where Rev. Dr. W. R. Henderson baptized him. Having graduated high school as a State Champion Half Miler, he was recruited by Norfolk State College to run track. He was the CIAA Champion three of four years in the mile or half mile and a member of the NCAA Championship team for two years consecutively.

He received his BS Degree and entered the U.S. Army as a Distinguished Military Graduate and commissioned RA Quartermaster detailed Infantry in 1975. He served as platoon leader, executive officer, S-3 Air, S-3, and

Company Commander during his first tour in the military. He was then selected to attend the University of Iowa where he received an MA Degree. His follow-on assignment was at the US Military Academy at West Point where he taught Physical Education for three years and coached track.

Rev. Diggs was called into the Gospel ministry while in command at Fort Hood, Texas. He preached his trial sermon at age 28 under the instruction of the late Rev. Dr. R. A. Abercrombie of the Marlboro Heights Missionary Baptist Church, Killeen, Texas in August 1980. While at the US Military Academy, West Point, New York, he entered seminary at the Nyack Missionary College (Christian Missionary Alliance Seminary) and began work towards a Master of Divinity Degree. He was later transferred to Fort Meade, MD where he continued his study at the Howard University Divinity School. He received his Master of Divinity Degree in May 1986.

"All things are possible with God", for he completed his seminary education at night and during the summers while on active duty. Rev. Diggs received catechetical instruction from Rev. Dr. Olin P. Moyd and was ordained April 1986 by the First Baptist Church of Guilford where Rev. Dr. John L. Wright is pastor. His ecclesiastical endorsement for the ministry of the chaplaincy was from the National Baptist Church USA Incorporated. Having completed all the academic and religious requirements, he applied for a branch transfer to the US Army Chaplain Corps; but he was turned down. He was told that in order for him to become a chaplain he had to be a reserve Captain. At the time, Chaplain Diggs was two months from being promoted to Major, on the Command and General Staff College school's list and already Regular Army. The chaplaincy stated he would have to resign his RA commission, decline promotion to Major and leave the military for one day to be reappointed the next day as a brand new chaplain, Captain in a reserve status.

It was on Easter Sunday 1986 that he sat down to pen his resignation. The last line of that letter read, "Jesus Christ gave up His life; the least I can do is give up a golden leaf." He was reappointed as a Chaplain in June 1986 and has served as a Battalion and Brigade level chaplain; during Operations Desert Storm and Desert Shield he served as the First Brigade First Cavalry Division, Brigade Chaplain and was awarded the Bronze Star Medal.He relinquished his duties as founding pastor of the Comanche Community Chapel in August 1992, which is now the largest chapel facility and congregation in the US Armed Forces. Having begun with only 175 people in 1986, by 1991 over 1200 worshippers gathered each Sunday to hear the Spirited Gospel messages delivered by Chaplain Diggs. In addition, a 350 member Children's Church, gathered at the same time to worship under his visionary leadership.

Having completed the Master of Arts in Religious Studies with a concentration in Ethics (May 1993), he served as Ethics Instructor and Chaplain to the US Army Logistics Management College in Fort Lee, Virginia. Having completed special research and writing on a dissertation entitled, "American Women in Combat: An Ethical Issue" he attained the Doctor of Ministry Degree from Howard University's School of Divinity in May 1994. God is good.

Having turned down attendance to the U. S. Army Division Chaplains' Course and a below the zone selection to Colonel, on July 7, 1996 he became the fifth Pastor of the Tabernacle Baptist Church in Petersburg, Virginia. In addition to serving as Pastor, Dr. Diggs has held positions in various organizations over the years to include: Chairman of Finance for the Virginia Baptist State Convention, member of the Board of Directors of the Appomattox Education Foundation for the Governors School in Petersburg, Virginia, state convention appointed trustee to the Children's Home of Virginia Baptist, and member of the Board of Directors at the Virginia State University Credit Union. Dr. Diggs is currently a member of the Petersburg Chamber of Commerce.

Dr. Diggs retired from active duty on July 2, 1998 receiving the Legion of Merit; the highest military award given during peace, signed by the President of the United States. His other military awards include the Bronze Star Medal, the Meritorious Service Medal (4th Oak Leaf Cluster), the Army Commendation Medal (2nd Oak Leaf Cluster), the Army Achievement Medal (2nd Oak Leaf Cluster), the National Defense Medal, the South East Asia Medal, the Kuwait Liberation Medal, the Parachute Badge and the Air Assault Badge.

He is married to Dr. Christine Heath Diggs, and they have three gifts from God: Robert Jr.; Schnequa and Christopher.

Reverend Diggs' life grounding text is "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (Philippians 4:13).
