

## 2019-2020 LVBATORS MODERATORS



### Rev. Dr. Robert L. Elliott, Jr. LVBA Moderator

Rev. Dr. Robert Lincoln. Elliott, Jr. is a native and currently resides in Claremont, located in Surry County, Virginia. Having four sisters, he is the only son born to the late Deacon Robert L., Sr and Deaconess Dolly Elliott. After attending and graduating from Surry County Public Schools, he attended Norfolk State University before joining the United States Air Force. For four years while in the Air Force, he worked diligently with the Military Police Unit. That was where God taught him tolerance for all people in all circumstances.

Returning to civilian life, he joined the Prince George County Police Department where he remained fourteen years, ending his service as a detective and the unofficial chaplain for the department. Pastor Elliott knew soon after God had a higher calling for him.

As a child of God and an anointed "leader of the flock", Pastor Elliott took the helm at Morning Star Baptist Church in 2001 - the church where he was baptized, where he was ordained as a deacon in 1988, where he was licensed as a minister in 1991, and where his family still actively attends. Being born into a musically gifted family, he truly believes that we should "make a joyful noise unto the Lord" and will often begin or end his sermons with a soulful musical offering.

Pastor Elliott's growth at Morning Star Baptist Church with the late Rev. Dr. E. L. Fleming as his pastor peaked when the Lord said, "Son, you are now ready" and God presented His choice for a messenger to the people in August 1991. Pastor Elliott grew under the functioning of the Holy Spirit and God sent him to the Union Baptist Church in Spring Grove, Virginia to lead His people. In February 1995, Pastor Elliott was ordained and served as the pastor of the Union Baptist Church for seven years.

Pastor Elliott continued his matriculation in the realms of Theology at the Richmond Virginia Seminary. In 1997, he received his Bachelor's degree from the Seminary. He has always believed in the power of prayer and possessed a strong desire to devote all of his time to doing the work of the Lord. He prayed and asked God to make a way. In March 2001, God answered his prayer and he was officially installed as the proud pastor of the Morning Star Baptist Church. In May of 2003, he became the recipient of a Master of Divinity degree and just three years later, on May 1, 2006, Rev. Elliott became the recipient of an earned Doctorate degree in Ministry from his alma mater.

Pastor Elliott is the husband of Deaconess Jacqueline Whitley Elliott, and the father of Robert III and his daughter, the late Tavonne Sade. Through God's spiritual guidance, Pastor Elliott instilled the vision of building a new sanctuary where current and prospective members can come together to praise and worship. In December 2008, the vision became a reality and the doors to the new sanctuary were opened to all.

Under his guidance as the spiritual shepherd for his Morning Star Family, Pastor Elliott has led his flock to greater heights and a better understanding of the infinite wisdom, mercies and goodness of God through His Word. His mission in life is to fulfill his vow to lead others to Christ and give God the best of his service.



### Rev. Dr. Bobby Lee Taylor 1st Vice-Moderator

The Reverend Dr. Bobby Lee Taylor was born in Evergreen, Alabama to Earnestine Minnie Lee Taylor and is the oldest of thirteen (13) children. At the age of eleven (11), he accepted Christ as his Lord and Savior and was baptized at the Mount Zion Baptist Church in Owassa, Alabama. He was educated in the public school system of Evergreen, Alabama.

He accepted his calling to the Gospel ministry and was licensed to preach on August 14, 1983 and ordained on December 20, 1984. He has over 25 years of progressively responsible experience in church ministries and administrative leadership. He has preached in several states and accumulated many awards and achievements in his Christian journey.

Dr. Taylor is the former pastor of the Rising Mount Zion Baptist Church in Carson, Virginia, where he pastored for 9 years and led the church to achieve many goals in the Lord. All the ministries grew and the people advanced in knowledge and service to the Lord. Seven members were licensed to preach the gospel, 2 were ordained as ministers of education for adults and youths and 6 members were ordained as deacons.

Dr. Taylor's main goal as a minister and pastor is to be faithful to God, His people and ministry, to mold disciples, teach evangelistic attributes, develop active members and led the church to be a loving and inspirational foundation in the community.

Dr. Taylor's educational track is one of great magnitude and hard work. On May of 1995, he graduated from Piedmont International University in Raleigh, North Carolina, (formerly Atlantic Baptist Bible College) where he obtained a Bachelor's Degree in Christian Theology. On May 8, 2004, he received his Master of Divinity Degree from Virginia Union University, Samuel Dewitt Proctor School of Theology in Richmond, Virginia and on December 15, 2006, he received his Doctor of Ministry Degree from the United Theological Seminary in Dayton, Ohio. Dr. Taylor's dissertation concentrated on "Mentoring Tools for Associate Ministers in a Local Church Setting."

Dr. Taylor was called as pastor to Sandy Mount Baptist Church on November 21, 2011.On May 18, 2013, he was elected 2nd Vice-Moderator of the Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association and Allied Bodies which consist of 18 churches and 4 Sunday School Unions.On July 13, 2017, he was elected 1st Vice-Moderator for the Association.

He is the founder and visionary of the Cathedral of Praise Ministry; an Outreach Ministry that provides workshops, seminars, mentoring tools for leaders and churches.

Dr. Taylor is married to the former Gail Yolanda Jones and they are residents of Chester, Virginia.He loves to preach and teach and he will preach and teach.One of his favorite scriptures is found in Proverbs 29:18, "Where there is no vision, the people perish." To God be the Glory.



### Rev. Alexander Bracey, III 2nd Vice-Moderator

Born June 25, 1970, in Norfolk, Virginia, Alexander Bracey, III is the second child and only son of the late Alexander Bracey, Jr. and Barbara Stanley Bracey who is now married to Jonathan Scott. He has one sibling, a sister, Mrs. Katrina D. Bracey Miller of Norfolk, Virginia.

He graduated from Norview High School in Norfolk, Virginia in 1989. He furthered his education by attending Elizabeth City State University where he earned his B.S. Degree in Business Administration concentrating in Economics and Finance. He earned his Master of Divinity degree at the Samuel DeWitt Proctor School of Theology at Virginia Union University on May 10, 2010.

Reverend Bracey is married to the lovely Miss Felicia Yvette Mullen, formally of Elizabeth City, North Carolina, and they are blessed with three beautiful children: Darius Travon, Alexis Danielle, and Ashleigh Alexander.

He is employed with the United States Navy as a "Regional Transportation Specialist," Norfolk Naval Base. Reverend Bracey's early spiritual education was gained at First Baptist Church, Berkley in Norfolk, Virginia. There, he was dedicated to the Church as an infant, baptized into the Body, attended youth meetings, fellowships, gatherings, Sunday School, and Vacation Bible School and ultimately became the Youth Moderator for the youth church under the leadership of the late Reverend Dr. William D. Tyree, Jr. and later, Reverend Dr. William D. Tyree, III.

Reverend Bracey has served as an associate minister of Gethsemane Baptist Church in Newport News, Virginia, under the pastorate of the Reverend Dr. Dwight S. Riddick, Sr. While there, he served as the Superintendent of the Sunday school and assisted with the leading of the men's ministry

He was ordained December 3, 2011 by Reverend Dr. Dwight S. Riddick, Sr. In March 2012, Reverend Bracey accepted the Call to become the Pastor of First Gravel Hill Baptist Church in Smithfield, Virginia. When God assigned Pastor Bracey to this branch of Zion, the Holy Spirit also equipped him with a vision to lead this body of believers to "Maximize the Mission of Jesus Christ".

Additionally, He serves as 2nd Vice Moderator with the Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association and Allied Bodies. 

- Union The action or fact of being joined. Comes from the Latin word "unus" meaning "One."
- Joined- Becoming linked or connected to.
- Union- A state of harmony or agreement.
- **Harmony-** The quality of forming a pleasing and consistent whole.
- **Agreement-** Harmony or accordance in opinion or feeling; a position or result of agreeing.

# A few definitions to begin our discussion

- **Unity-** The state of being united or joined as a whole. A thing forming a complex whole.
- Whole- All of; entire.
- United- joined together for a common purpose.
- Common Purpose- The prevalent reason for why something is done or created.

# **Definitions**

- Unity begins with the whole concept of "Let Us." We find this statement in two key places.
- Genesis 1:26- "Then God said, "Let Us make man in our own image, according to our Likeness..."
- Genesis 11:4- "They said, "Come let us build for ourselves a city, and a tower whose top will reach into Heaven..."
- The **KEY** to Unity is "**LET US**!" Us meaning the speaker referring to themselves as well as other people.

# "Let Us"

- Acts 5:9- "Then Peter said unto her, How is it that ye have agreed together to tempt the Spirit of the Lord? Behold the feet of them which have buried thy husband are at the door, and shall carry thee out."
- Background: Ananias and his wife Sapphira both agreed to lie to the Holy Spirit about the price that they charged for land that they owned. It in turn cost them their lives.

The previous examples were "Let us" being used with good intentions. The following example is what happens when unity is used in the wrong way. "Let Us" being used with dire consequences.

- (Reason why we must come together) Acts 1:4"Gathering them together, He commanded them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait for what the Father had promised, "Which," He said, "You heard from me."
- The promise as we know was the promise of the Holy Spirit. God desired to be in the midst of everything that we do, in order for him to do that, he promised to send us the Holy Spirit.

# How do we reach this positive level of Unity?

- Acts 2:1-4- "When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a noise like a violent rushing wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire distributing themselves, and they rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues as the Spirit was giving them utterance."
- Three takeaways from here...
  - The people had a oneness of voice- Upon receiving the Holy Spirit, the people began to speak with one voice.
  - ➤ The people had one mission- They were given the direction to "Wait." Key here is they all agreed to adhere to the instruction and Wait!
  - ➤ The people then started doing what they were commanded to do as ONE.



### Rev. Dr. Douglas F. Adams, Jr. - PASTORAL BIOGRAPHY

As a young adult, Dr. Adams, a native of East Orange, N.J., felt the inspiration to serve in church leadership. As a graduate of the Bible Seminary Institute (DBI) of the Evangelistic Centers, Inc., Newark N.J., he entered the ministry through field evangelism, traveling extensively in the U.S Upon accepting a Junior Pastorate of the headquarter churches of Evangelistic Centers, Inc. in Brooklyn (NY) and Newark (NJ), he continued in this capacity until he was drafted by the U.S. Army.

Following his military tour of duty, Dr. Adams shortly received Ecclesiastical Ordination in 1970 and relocated to central New Jersey to serve as Pastor of the congregants of Plainfield Evangelistic Center, Inc. He concurrently served in the role of dual prastorship as he served the congregational needs of Community Missions Alliance Church in the neighboring town of Metuchen, N.J. He founded and became National Chartered President of 501©3, (Evangelic Tabernacle, Inc.), an inter-denominational organization helping ministries, for which he is pastor-emeritus.

Dr. Adams' seminary training was further augmented as he studied at the Northeastern Bible College (a.k.a. The King's College-Columbia, NY), at Bloomfield College where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration with concentrations in Quantitative Methods/Operations Research, and Personnel and Marketing. He was the Graduation Class Scholastic Honor Key Recipient. He pursued his graduate education of a MBA at Fairleigh Dickinson University's Graduate School-NJ. In subsequent years he earned the Doctor of Divinity from Masters Graduate School of Divinity. As the graduate of several military leadership academies, including US Army Sergeants Major Academy, Texas, he has received numerous awards which include: Meritorious Service Medal-Oak Leaf Cluster, Army Commendation-Two Oak Leaf Cluster(s) and the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal. Dr. Adams managerially worked for Corporate America before retiring to Virginia. He is a trained "Classroom Facilitator" by the Intl. Atlantic Group and was presented the Xerox Corporation Leadership Award. In addition, he was awarded "The Black Achiever of Business Award" for Corporate and Community involvement by PSEG Corporation, (Public Service Electric and Gas Co.)

Dr. Adams is married to the former Vergena Rose Carter, his wife of 45 years. They have two adult children; Douglas, III and DeAnna Lynette.

During his residence in Virginia, until 2006, Dr. Adams was Associate Minister of the Lebanon Baptist Church in Surry, Virginia. He was later called to pastor the Jerusalem Baptist Church of Carsley, Virginia. While serving as pastor of the Jerusalem Baptist Church, he was elected as the 2nd Vice-Moderator of the Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association and Allied Bodies. As a civic leader, he served as the President of Surry County VA Chapter of the NAACP. He retired as pastor of Jerusalem Baptist Church in December 2012.

When his home church, Lebanon Baptist Church, in Surry County, lost its Shepard, Dr. Adams was called to step in as Interim Pastor. Having offered the church spiritual guidance, healing and direction, he was elected Pastor of Lebanon Baptist Church on November 18, 2014.

# **Teen Presentation - Stewardship**

First and foremost, I like to give honor to God for simply waking me up this morning and being of sound, mind, and body to speak to you this afternoon. I am by no means a preacher or some prolific speaker, but I've been known to engage the minds of people with thought provoking conversations so today that's just what we are going to have. Is that all right with you? Just a little conversation on stewardship.

I would like to give thanks to Minister James who thought it not robbery to invite me to come and speak with you for a little while. I am thankful and grateful for the opportunity that you have afforded me.

To the Pastor of this great church, Dr. Elliott I thank you and all clergy who represent the Lebanon Virginia Baptist Association and Allied Bodies I greet you. And I would be remised if I did not acknowledge and say thank you to my Pastor the Reverend George Ellis Brown Sr. for equipping me with the tutelage to stand before you this afternoon.

I won't be before you long but I do have a task and I would like to be obedient. I was given the topic of stewardship...So in doing some independent research of stewardship, I ran across several definitions but there was one in particular that stood out to me the most. It stated, 'biblical stewardship is one of the primary ways God calls us to live our life.

In general, to be a steward is to simply manage something on someone's behalf. Whether it's a family member, a co-worker, or even employer that may ask you to watch over something, then you're stewarding-you're managing- whatever they entrusted to your care. 1 Peter 4:10 its states, "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms. If one would recall the words of Jesus in Acts 20:35, He proclaims, there is more happiness in giving than receiving.

Often you might hear me say, what's the purpose of being blessed with a gift from God that you just keep to yourself. Gifts are meant to be shared because this is how God test us. Why should he give us more, if we don't know what to do with what we already possess? As generous distributors of God's manifold grace, put your gifts at the service of one another, each in the measure he has received 1 Peter 4:8-10. This isn't me talking, it's in the book.

The Bible goes on to declare that stewardship is another way of talking about how to live your life. But it gets a little deeper than the mere definition that I read into your hearing. You see when you are a steward for God; you have to get rid of that Burger King mentality. You know the, "you can have it your way" Well I've come to learn that God's way is the only way and there is no in between. Now am I saying that on this Christian journey you won't get side tracked or set back, absolutely not but if you give me a few moments of your time, I can assure you serving God will turn those setbacks into comebacks and those trials that you are stressing out will be the triumphs that you shout and praise him about.

So, as I am continuing to study, I came across 4 main biblical principles of stewardship. There is ownership; there's responsibility; there's accountability, and then there's Reward.

The principle of ownership – is the primary principle of stewardship. God owns everything; we are simply the administrators acting on his behalf. Few Christians object to the understanding that God owns everything. In 1 Chronicles 29:12, it proclaims, riches and honor come from you, and you are the ruler of everything. It didn't say God was the ruler of some things, or even many things but EVERYTHING!! Power and might are in your hand, and it is in your hand to make great and to give strength to all. Our lives are simply loans provided to us by God. God is no different than a bank, if you don't pay on that loan, they will come to collect.

The principle of responsibility – We are responsible for how we treat and what we do with what God gives us. It is our responsibility to follow his commandments. It is our responsibility to do His will. It is our responsibility to be stewards. To put our faith into the work that we do for Christ.

The principle of accountability – we individually are and will be held accountable for all that we do. Now it's easy to be accountable for the right that we do but how many times do we acknowledge accountability when we do wrong.

The principle of reward – Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for man, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward.

It is the Lord Christ Jesus that you are serving. As a young child I was always told that only what you do for Christ will last and I didn't get it then, but I can assure you, I get it now. The problem with most is that they want to be rewarded for little or nothing. There are more concerned with that instant gratification than putting in the work. It's that I have to have it right now mentality. Well I was taught at a young age anything easy isn't worth having and anything worth having requires work and this is why we have to be stewards and do the will of God if we want to inherit the kingdom.

We should all long to hear the Master say what he exclaims in Matthew 25:21 well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with few things; I will put you in charge of many things; Come on in and share your Masters happiness.

*2 Corinthians 9:6-7 states,* "The person who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the person who sows generously will also reap generously. Each person should do as he has decided in his heart—not reluctantly or out of necessity, for God loves a cheerful giver."

Isn't it strange how endless an hour seems when we are serving God, but how short it is when we watch a Football game for 60 minutes?

Isn't it strange that you can't find things to say when you're praying, but you have no trouble on thinking what to talk about with a friend?

Isn't it strange how difficult and boring it is to read one chapter of the Bible but how easy it is to read 100 pages of a popular novel?

Isn't it strange how everyone wants front-row-tickets to concerts or games, but they do whatever is possible to sit at the last row in the church?

Isn't it strange how we need to know about an event for the church 2-3 weeks before the day so we can include it in our agenda, but we can adjust it for other events in the last minute?

Isn't it strange how difficult it is to learn a fact about God to share it with others, but how easy it is to learn, understand, extend and repeat gossip?

Isn't it strange how we believe everything that magazines and newspapers say, but we question the words in the Bible?

Isn't it strange how everyone wants a place in heaven, but they don't want to believe, do, or say anything to get there?

Isn't it strange how we send jokes in e-mails and they are forwarded right away, but when we are going to send messages about God, we think about it twice before we share it with others?

IT'S STRANGE ISN'T IT?

# **PRINCIPLES**

Merriam Webster Deluxe Dictionary defines "Principles" as a comprehensive and fundamental law, doctrine, or assumption. "Principles" have an undeniable capacity to transform our thinking and crystallize our priorities with motivation.

Each law is distinctive, but all are relevant to one another, which takes a whole-life view of this subject. It touches virtually every aspect of life and everything God puts into our hands. It is all – encompassing; and the Christian steward's constant challenge is to make the most of every resource, which moves to stewardship, the office, duties and obligations of a steward.



# PRINCIPLES (Cont'd)

You see all too often the word <u>stewardship</u> is given a very <u>narrow definition</u>, <u>focusing only</u> on the <u>management</u> of <u>money</u>. It is so much more than that. Stewardship encompasses virtually every part of life. It is the wise purposeful management of all that we have and all that we are.

To understand stewardship is to grasp the essence of life's meaning. To practice stewardship is to fulfill that meaning in a way that pleases God and satisfies the most profound human longings. There are timeless principles of stewardship—laws established in God's character and expressed in His Word.



# THE LAWS OF RIGHTFUL OWNERSHIP

... which says that nothing truly belongs to us. Everything belongs to God.





- Think of yourself as the manager of a trust.
- Think of each day as an opportunity for service and stewardship
- Think of money as a means to an end, not the end itself.

# THE LAW OF PURPOSEFUL POSSESSION

# Wise Stewards are guided by Lordship and NOT Hoardship.







The story is told of an old man who was rich in possessions, yet utterly poor because he did not use what was in his hands. He was wealthy, but he gained no advantage from the wealth. Strangely but deliberately, he hoarded the things that could have made his life totally different. As a steward he failed miserably, neglecting the phenomenal resources at his disposal—money. He died of starvation.



# LIVING THE LAWS

# As one lives out this "Law of Purposeful Possession", keep these thoughts in mind:

- Richness toward God comes through seeing everything as a gift from God's hand. Whatever we receive in money or material goods or opportunities or in the moments of each day, is purely and simply a gift from God. It is an expression of His love, an evidence of His grace. Every possession is entrusted to us to steward and enjoy and use for His purposes.
- Richness towards God comes through seeking His direction before settling on decisions. This is the essence of seeking first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, desiring above all else to do His will. The seeking happens continually, as we commune with God and communicate with Him throughout the day; and whenever we receive "windfall" blessings, the first order of business is to ask, "Lord what is your purpose in this? What do you want me to do?"

# LIVING THE LAWS (Cont'd)


• Richness towards God comes through caring more about giving than getting. The rich man of the parable was consumed with greed and he cared nothing about giving. And lest we condemn his, let us remember that every person has the same capacity for the same sin. The challenge is to think inclusively about others instead of exclusively about ourselves, for in doing so, we grow rich toward God and satisfied in His pleasure. Generously at every opportunity, we fulfill our purpose and honor His name.

# MISSION SPEAKER Rev. Dr. Wendell M. Waller

Reverend Wendell M. Waller is a 1980 graduate of Virginia Commonwealth University, where he in majored in Political Science, and a 1983 graduate of the New England School of Law, Boston, Massachusetts, where he received his Juris Doctorate Degree. In addition to his legal studies, Reverend Waller also studied at the Andover Newton Theological School, Andover Newton Centre, Massachusetts.

Reverend Waller has been proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ for almost thirty years. He was licensed to preach in 1978 by Westwood Baptist Church, Richmond, Virginia under the pastorate of Dr. Robert G. Murray. He was ordained in 1985 by the Baptist General Convention of Massachusetts, New Hampshire and Rhode Island.and currently, serves as Pastor of Christian Home Baptist Church, Windsor, Virginia, where he has been serving since 1988. He is a member of the Lott Carey Foreign Mission Pastoral Excellence Program and has been involved in mission work in Guyanna, South America, Jamaica, and Zimbabwe, South Africa.

Reverend Waller also serves as chief legal counsel for the Suffolk City School Board, a position he has held since 1997 and has also served as a substitute judge in the general district court for the Fifth Judicial Circuit.

### LVBA Mission Program Facilitator – Rev. Dr. Glenn E. Porter

Dr. Porter began the session by brainstorming, soliciting spontaneous ideas, with those in attendance. He posed the question "What is the role of a Missionary?"

Responses were:

helping going out to help service spreading the word and demonstrating the word of God; doing the job God gave us working

He cited Matthew 28:18-20 - The Great Commission.

\*\* And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth.

<sup>19</sup> Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: <sup>20</sup> Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen.

As Missionaries, Dr. Porter informed us that our purpose is threefold:

- 1) Intent that we GO
- 2) Extent that we GO into all of the world
- Content that we share the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Stating that Jesus was not stationary; he requires us to be prepared to "Go". He used Mark Chapter 1 to illustrate his point. Throughout the verses, we see the word "straightway". If we do not "Go", then we are robbing the world of Jesus Christ.

Dr. Porter also cited the scripture text Matthew 25:31-40 to illustrate missions.

31 When the Son of man shall come in his glory, and all the holy angels with him, then shall he sit upon the throne of his glory: 32 And before him shall be gathered all nations: and he shall separate them one from another, as a shepherd divideth his sheep from the goats: 33 And he shall set the sheep on his right hand, but the goats on the left. 34 Then shall the King say unto them on his right hand, Come, ye blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world: 35 For I was an hungred, and ye gave me meat: I was thirsty, and ye gave me drink: I was a stranger, and ye took me in: 36 Naked, and ye clothed me: I was sick, and ye visited me: I was in prison, and ye came unto me. 37 Then shall the righteous answer him, saying, Lord, when saw we thee an hungred, and fed thee? or thirsty, and gave thee drink? 38 When saw we thee a stranger, and took thee in? or naked, and clothed thee? 39 Or when saw we thee sick, or in prison, and came unto thee? 40 And the King shall answer and say unto them, Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me.

He stated, as Missionaries, we must be open, ready and receptive to defend and articulate the Word of God.

The session ended with attendees offering suggestions of mission ideas and explaining what is occurring in their respective churches.
